

Monday Folder Update

April 26, 2010

Listed is what is planned for this week:

Bible (6th): The memory verse for the week comes from Revelation 7:9-10. The students will be required to write the verse on Wednesday of this week. Please ensure they memorize the verses. The verse for next week is: Revelation 20:13-15.

Math 7/6 (6th grade): We are going over concepts. Some students are having a problem with fractions: i.e. reducing; finding a common denominator; factoring to reduce; multiplying or dividing by a multiple of one to create common denominators; Prime Numbers; and other basic concepts that they will need to grasp to be successful in mathematics the next few years.

Math 7/6 Plus (6th grade): Lessons 129 through 132 were due and the students will take tests through Lesson 130. The next week, the students will complete the Math 7/6 textbook and we will begin Math 8/7.

Math 8/7 (6th) & Algebra 1 (6th): Independent work at the student's own pace. Test after every five lessons.

Science (6th): Continuing our study of Chapter 9: Motion and Machines. Students should have read up to page 226 and had notes ready for today. Today they re-accomplished some science activity worksheets.

History (6th): We finished Chapter 10. This morning, the students took quizzes over the rest of the chapter. By tomorrow morning, they should have read and made notes through page 211. I gave them study guides for chapters 10 and 11 this morning. The end of chapter test is a combination chapters 10/11, so will not be given until we complete Chapter 11.

Math 6/5 (5th): We worked on Lesson 92 today, it dealt with finding the greatest common factor (GCF) for two numbers..

Science (5th): The students should have read and made notes over pages up to 230. We will have a test over Chapter 9 tomorrow. Study guides and notes may be used for the test.

History (5th): We are studying Chapter 12, Christianity: the Greatest Force in History. Students should have read and made notes up through page 194 by tomorrow morning.

Completed science projects are due into the classroom no later than 3 May, next Monday.
